*City law requires any person who makes independent expenditures or membership communications of more than \$1,000 to support or oppose a City candidate or ballot measure to notify the City Ethics Commission by fax or telegram within 24 hours of making the expenditure. State law defines an independent expenditure as a payment made by any person in connection with a communication that expressly advocates the nomination, election or defeat of a clearly identified candidate or the qualification, passage or defeat of a clearly identified measure, or which, taken as a whole, unambiguously urges a particular result in an election, but which is not made at the behest of or in cooperation, concert, or coordination with the affected candidate or committee or agent.
