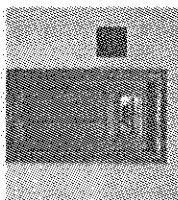
June 18, 2013
Zimmer votes to award the contract to Apple

November 5, 2013
LAUSD Board approves deal to purchase iPads for students

January 2014
Zimmer votes to purchase iPads and iPad mini devices

December 2014
FBI agents reviewed 20 boxes of records from LAUSD's servers

May 13, 2015
Zimmer is forced to admit his purchase of iPads cost taxpayers millions



Zimmer's Private Meetings with Apple
According to records obtained by the Los Angeles Times, Zimmer met privately with Apple on December 21, 2012 and January 7, 2013. Bidding opened on February 19, 2013. On June 18, 2013, Zimmer votes to award the contract to Apple.

Zimmer Opposes Oversight Committee Recommendations and Votes To Expand iPad Program

In January 2014, Zimmer voted to plain ahead with and expand the iPad program, rejecting an oversight panel's advice that the district purchase thousands fewer of the devices. (Source: LA Times, January 2014)

FBI Launches Corruption Investigation

In December 2014, FBI agents reviewed 20 boxes of records from LAUSD headquarters. A federal grand jury subpoena said these documents are part of a criminal investigation, which appears to be focused on events leading up to the iPad contract approval and answer questions about whether Apple and Pearson.
